

The Trial: A Place of God's Will



As We Gather

Our Lord knows how changeable our wills are and how vast are the forces that fight against us as His people; therefore, He teaches us to pray, "Thy will be done." As Luther explains in the Large Catechism, "Just as God's name is holy in itself, and we still pray that it be holy among us, so also His kingdom comes of itself, without our prayer. Yet we still pray that it may come to us, that is, triumph among us and with us, so that we may be a part of those people among whom His name is hallowed and His kingdom prospers" (Part III, The Second Petition, p. 414). This evening, we meditate upon the trial of Jesus, seeing in this place the trials of the world that fight against God's will and yet also seeing the work of God, bringing salvation to the world and making the place of trial a place of His eternal will.

READING

Romans 7:14-25

¹⁴For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am of the flesh, sold under sin. ¹⁵For I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. ¹⁶Now if I do what I do not want, I agree with the law, that it is good. ¹⁷So now it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me. ¹⁸For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out. ¹⁹For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing. ²⁰Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me. ²¹So I find it to be a law that when I want to do right, evil lies close at hand. ²²For I delight in the law of God, in my inner being, ²³but I see in my members another law waging war against the law of my mind and making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. ²⁴Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? ²⁵Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself serve the law of God with my mind, but with my flesh I serve the law of sin.

PSALM

Psalm 119:89-96, responsively by verse

Pastor:

Forever, O Lord, Your word is firmly fixed in the heavens.

People:

Your faithfulness endures to all generations; You have established the earth, and it stands fast.

Pastor:

By Your appointment they stand this day, for all things are Your servants.

People:

If Your law had not been my delight, I would have perished in my

affliction.

Pastor:

I will never forget Your precepts, for by them You have given me life.

People:

I am Yours; save me, for I have sought Your precepts.

Pastor:

The wicked lie in wait to destroy me, but I consider Your testimonies.

People:

I have seen a limit to all perfection, but Your commandment is exceedingly broad. Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

NARRATOR: Now the men who were holding Jesus in custody were mocking Him as they beat Him. They also blindfolded Him and kept asking Him,

Prophesy! Who is it that struck You?

NARRATOR: And they said many other things against Him, blaspheming Him. When day came, the assembly of the elders of the people gathered together, both chief priests and scribes. And they led Him away to their council, and they said,

If you are the Christ, tell us.

NARRATOR: But He said to them.

JESUS: If I tell you, you will not believe, and if I ask you, you will not answer. But from now on the Son of Man shall be seated at the right hand of the power of God.

NARRATOR: So they all said,

Are you the Son of God, then?

NARRATOR: And He said to them,

JESUS: You say that I am.

NARRATOR: Then they said,

What further testimony do we need? We have heard it ourselves from His own lips.

NARRATOR: Then the whole company of them arose and brought Him before Pilate. And they began to accuse Him, saying,

CHIEF PRIESTS & SCRIBES: We found this man misleading our nation and forbidding us to give tribute to Caesar, and saying that He Himself is Christ, a king.

NARRATOR: And Pilate asked Him,

PILATE: Are you the King of the Jews?

NARRATOR: And He answered him,

JESUS: You have said so.

NARRATOR: Then Pilate said to the chief priests and the crowds,

PILATE: I find no guilt in this man.

NARRATOR: But they were urgent, saying,

CHIEF PRIESTS & SCRIBES: He stirs up the people, teaching throughout all Judea, from Galilee even to this place.

NARRATOR: When Pilate heard this, he asked whether the man was a Galilean. And when he learned that He belonged to Herod's jurisdiction, he sent Him over to Herod, who was himself in Jerusalem at that time. When Herod saw Jesus, he was very glad, for he had long desired to see Him, because he had heard about Him, and he was hoping to see some sign done by Him. So he questioned Him at some length, but He made no answer. The chief priests and the scribes stood by, vehemently accusing Him. And Herod with his soldiers treated Him with contempt and mocked Him.

Then, arraying Him in splendid clothing, he sent Him back to Pilate. And Herod and Pilate became friends with each other that very day, for before this they had been at enmity with each other.

NARRATOR: Pilate then called together the chief priests and the rulers and the people, and said to them,

PILATE: You brought me this man as one who was misleading the people. And after examining Him before you, behold, I did not find this man guilty of any of your charges against Him. Neither did Herod, for he sent Him back to us. Look, nothing deserving death has been done by Him. I will therefore punish and release Him.

NARRATOR: But they all cried out together,

Away with this man, and release to us Barabbas

NARRATOR: —a man who had been thrown into prison for an insurrection started in the city and for murder. Pilate addressed them once more, desiring to release Jesus, but they kept shouting,

Crucify, crucify Him!

NARRATOR: A third time he said to them,

PILATE: Why, what evil has He done? I have found in Him no guilt deserving death. I will therefore punish and release Him.

NARRATOR: But they were urgent, demanding with loud cries that He should be crucified. And their voices prevailed. So Pilate decided that their demand should be granted. He released the man who had been thrown into prison for insurrection and murder, for whom they asked, but he delivered Jesus over to their will.





from all dangers to body and soul.


Pastor:




