HISTORY OF THE SERVICE OF NINE LESSONS AND CAROLS

The Festival of Lessons and Carols, which has been made famous by the choir of King's College, Cambridge, England, was first held on Christmas Eve 1918. It was planned by Eric Milner-White, who had just been appointed Dean of the college. A revision of the Order of Service was made in 1919, involving rearrangement of the lessons, and from that date the service has always begun with the hymn, "Once in Royal David's City." Other hallmarks of the service include the Bidding Prayer for All People, the singing of "O Come, All Ye Faithful" after the last lesson, and "Hark, the Herald Angels Sing" as the recessional. In almost every year some carols have been changed or added. The backbone of the service, the lessons and the prayers, has remained virtually unchanged.

Almost immediately other churches adapted the service for their own use. It has been broadcast by the BBC annually since 1930, even during the Second World War, and has been heard by millions of listeners throughout the world. One person wrote the college that he heard the broadcast of the service while in a tent on the foothills of Mount Everest.

Wherever the service is heard and however it is adapted, the pattern and strength of the service, as Dean Milner-White pointed out, are in the lessons, and not the music: "The main theme is the development of the loving purposes of God seen through the windows and words of the Bible." The center of the service, God's promise of salvation through Christ, is still found by those who "in heart and mind go even unto Bethlehem," and who submit to follow where the story leads.






The First Lesson

God tells sinful Adam that he has lost the life of Paradise and that his seed will bruise the serpent's head. Genesis 3

nd they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. But the Lord God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" And he said, "I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, and I hid myself." He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten of the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?" The man said, "The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit of the tree, and I ate." Then the Lord God said to the woman, "What is this that you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate." The Lord God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, cursed are you above all livestock and above all beasts of the field; on your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel." To the woman he said, "I will surely multiply your pain in childbearing; in pain you shall bring forth children. Your desire shall be for your husband, and he shall rule over you." And to Adam he said, "Because you have listened to the voice of your wife and have eaten of the tree of which I commanded you, 'You shall not eat of it,' cursed is the ground because of you; in pain you shall eat of it all the days of your life; thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you; and you shall eat the plants of the field. By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread, till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; for you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

This, the First Lesson.






The Second Lesson

This, the Second Lesson.




The Third Lesson

This, the Third Lesson.




The Fourth Lesson

The Fifth Lesson


The angel Gabriel greets the Blessed Virgin Mary. St Luke 1

St Luke tells of the birth of Jesus. St Luke 2




The Seventh Lesson

When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet: "And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him."
