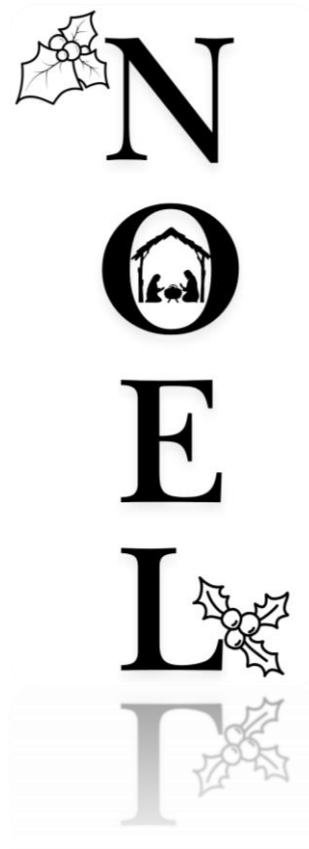

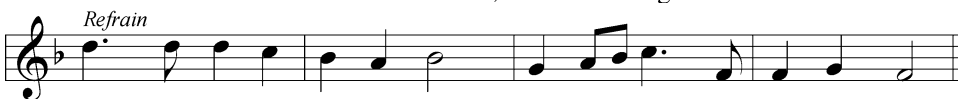

Candle Lighting Ceremony

The use of candles in this special service symbolizes that Christ is the light of the world. Each worshiper is given a candle to hold as a reminder that we carry the light of Christ with us everywhere we go—in our work, our neighborhoods, our schools, and our homes.

The candle in the center of the Advent wreath is a Christ candle, symbolizing that Christ is the light of the world. The candle-lighting this evening begins with the Pastor lighting his candle from the Christ Candle. He then lights the ushers' candles. The ushers then share that light across the congregation. (Please be sure to hold lit candles upright. The candle being lit should be dipped into the flame of the lit candle.)

As the light spreads and grows we rejoice that Christ did indeed come into our world. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it" (John 1:5).

P The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined.... Arise, shine; for your Light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you.

Jesus said, "I am the light of the world; he who follows Me will not walk in darkness but will have the Light of Life."

You are the Light of the World ... Let your light so shine before others, that they may see your good works and give glory to Your Father who is in heaven.

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among all with whom He is pleased!"

With the church organ broken down in Oberndorf, Austria, Pastor Mohr took the words to a poem he had written a few years before to the church's organist, Franz Gruber, asking him to write a melody for it that could be sung with guitar. From such a simple beginning came the beloved Christmas hymn, "Silent Night."
