#### **AS WE GATHER**

**Sola Fide**- is a Latin term for Faith alone. Faith is only as good as its object. Faith in Christ is bold only because of its object- Jesus Christ. When the One that you believe in is the crucified and risen One, Jesus Christ our Lord, the very Son of God, enthroned at the right hand of the Father, then your faith will be bold. Martin Luther writes: "Faith is a vital, deliberate trust in God's grace, so certain that it would die a thousand times for it." (FC SD IV, 12) He is simply echoing the book of Hebrews. "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1) *Sola Fide* means that faith is never alone: it always has its object, and when the object of faith is *Sola Christi*, then we know that Christ has done it all, for you!

May the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus




