




Opening Verses

- For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you might follow in his steps.
- He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth.
- **P** When he was reviled, he did not revile in return;
- When he suffered, he did not threaten, but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly.
- P He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree,
- That we might die to sin and live to righteousness.

Confession and Absolution

- Let us confess our sins to God, asking his forgiveness for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ, who suffered for us.
- Almighty God, I do not often follow in my Savior's steps. I do not walk in love as he walked. I do not put the interests of others ahead of my own interests. I sin against you in my thoughts, words and actions. For the sake of Jesus, who carried my sins to the cross, have mercy and forgive me
- Jesus suffered for us. He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. Because of Jesus' innocent suffering and death, you have been declared not guilty. By Jesus' command, I announce to you that your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
- Lord Jesus, help us to follow you and to entrust our lives, as you did, into the hands of our heavenly Father.



Prayer of the Day

Our heavenly Father, we often pray, "Hallowed be thy name," but often we forget to hallow your name by our actions as well as by our words. Help us to keep your name holy in everything we do and in the attitudes that accompany our actions. When we are falsely accused, enable us to put our trust in you. Let our lives give evidence of your love. Let our actions match our confession of faith. Help us to remember that your Son was falsely accused and ridiculed by sinful men. Make us mindful that Jesus was cursed that we might be blessed and punished that we might be pardoned. Then, remembering, help us to "bless those who persecute us and to pray for those that mistreat us." In Jesus' name. Amen.

Luke 8:1-3

Soon afterward he went on through cities and villages, proclaiming and bringing the good news of the kingdom of God. And the twelve were with him, and also some women who had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities: Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out, and Joanna, the wife of Chuza, Herod's household manager, and Susanna, and many others, who provided for them out of their means.

Second Reading

Matthew 10:21-31

Brother will deliver brother over to death, and the father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death, and you will be hated by all for my name's sake. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. When they persecute you in one town, flee to the next, for truly, I say to you, you will not have gone through all the towns of Israel before the Son of Man comes. A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a servant above his master. It is enough for the disciple to be like his teacher, and the servant like his master. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign those of his household. So have no fear of them, for nothing is covered that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known. What I tell you in the dark, say in the light, and what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows.
